- · Which is followed by a time of judgment.
- · The people cry out.
- · Then revival comes.

2. We cry out for revival because He CAN save us.

The psalmist prayed for revival so that "glory may dwell in our land" (v. 9).

God's glory is HIM—His presence, nature, and character.

What happens when God chooses to manifest Himself and the people cry out for Him?

- · It revives the church.
- It awakens the lost.
- · It transforms the culture.
- It advances the mission.

The purpose of revival is to get the church back in its rightful position, sharing Christ with a needy world so that God's kingdom could come and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

3. We cry out for revival because He is **NEAR!**

Surely his salvation is near to those who fear him (v. 9).

- If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land (2 Chron. 7:14).
- · Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you (James 4:8).

What can we do?

- · We can <u>TURN</u>—turn and repent and return to the Lord with all of your heart.
- We can PRAY.
- We can <u>UNITE</u> together—purpose of the OneCry movement is to create a highway across nation to join together to cry out to the Lord for nationwide revival and spiritual awakening.
