Discontentment—A Murmuring Heart

1. Its Characteristics

Whine rather than worship Discontented with what they have Fueled by comparisons Doubts God's goodness and love Forgets God's past provisions Rejects God's plan

2. Its "Causes"

When we have what we don't want or don't have what we want <u>Things</u> <u>People</u> <u>Circumstances</u>

3. Its Consequences

Robs us of joy God's presence departs Discouragement, depression, despair Vulnerable to sin Gives the world a wrong opinion about God
